Fall Central Program JTED classes are filling fast as students use a new online registration process. The new website system started January 10th.

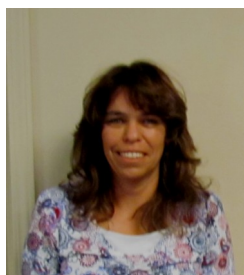

Welcome New JTED Governing Board Members

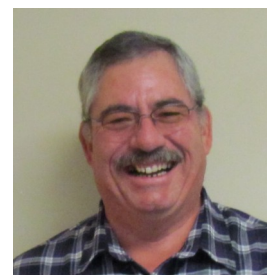
